**Open Discussion:**

What are your (organization's) priorities for environmental peacebuilding in 2021?

- To facilitate and strengthen the **interface between science and policy-makers**/based institutions through articles, conferences, webinars, and more.
- To provide input towards the **Norwegian government on environmental peacebuilding** issues, in light of their new Security Council seat.
  - Norway to make environmental peacebuilding a key issue.
- To strengthen work on the **protection of civilians and the environment** through collaborations and online events.
- To work with partners in Syria and Iraq to set up trainings on **documenting environmental change** with data/remote sensing technology.
- To develop a policy paper and **recommendations for UNEA-5** on nature based solutions.
- To conclude and publish analytic work on the **global observatory on water and peace**.
- To develop a training on **transboundary water cooperation** between Iraq and Turkey.
- To help a broader audience of people understand environmental peacebuilding challenges by **developing an easier language of explanation**.
- To establish a 2021 road map for the **protection of environmental defenders**, and how the human rights council resolution may be actually implemented.
- To shape the new UNDP strategic plan with a **risk informed development offer**.
