

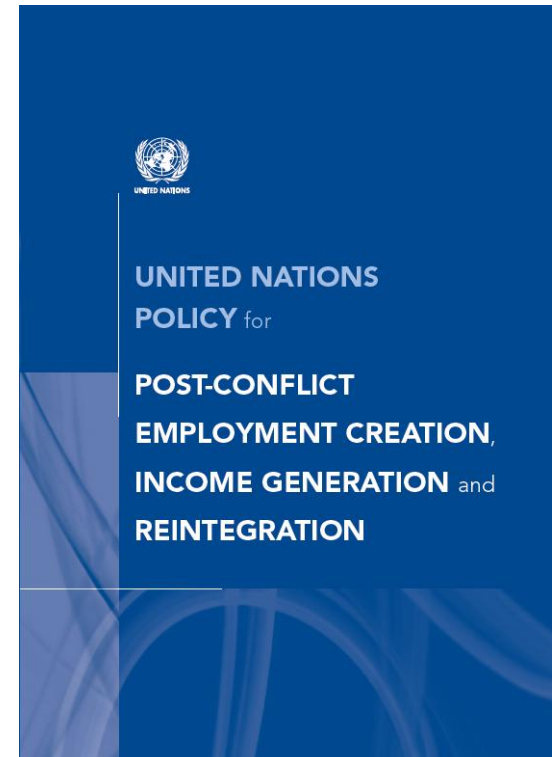

Innovation in balancing security and development

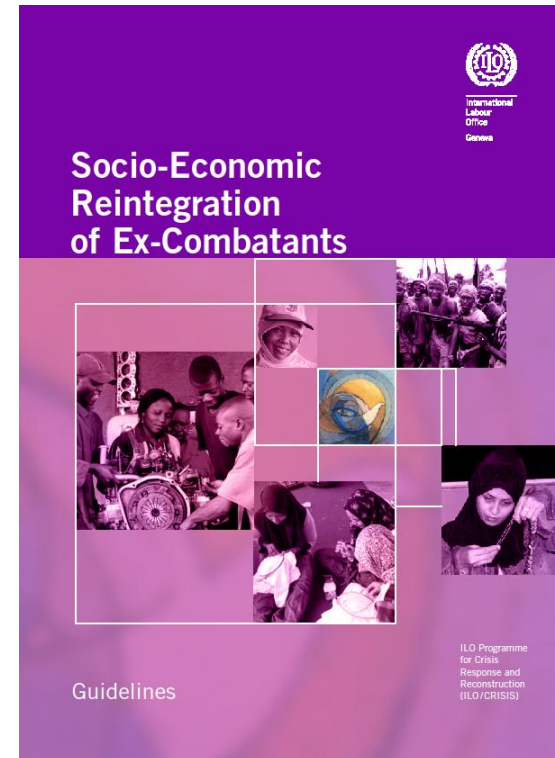

- Peace through employment
- Lack of income and livelihoods leads to conflict
- Employment = peace and stability
- Need for early employment generation with a systematic approach towards sustained development



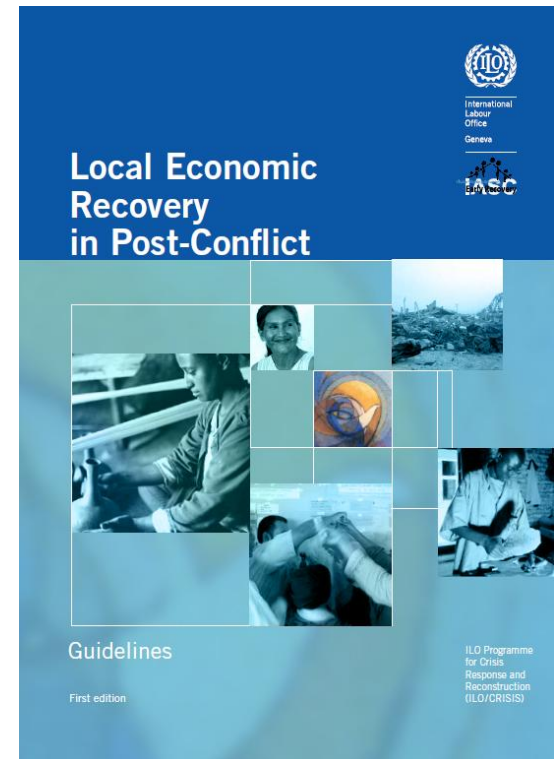
Inclusive approach based on equity and security

- During the interim stabilization/transition all programmes must be inclusive
- Programmes should target communities of reinsertion, not ex-combatants only
- Interim stabilization should aim to create immediate job opportunities, sustainable livelihoods and institutional capacity simultaneously



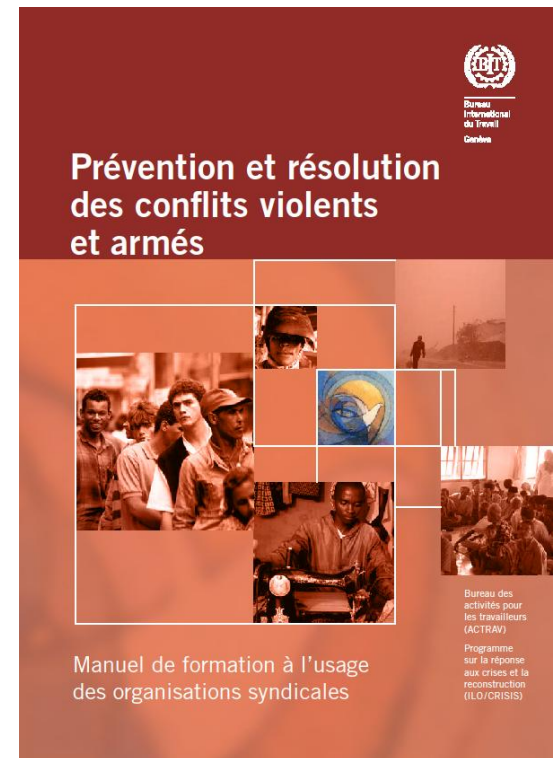
Community level reintegration

- Rebuilding communities
- Investments for local recovery and reconstruction
- Development of local capacities
- Creative solutions from local and global knowledge



Comprehensive labour market assessment, value chain analysis, training for the “right trade”

- Stabilization programmes geared to needs of youth emerging from conflict
- Attention not only to the supply side of labour but also stimulus on demand
- Private-public sector partnerships to engage youth/enhance entrepreneurship
- Active role of social partners in conflict resolution



Coexisting programmes and policies

- During interim stabilization both upstream policy work and downstream stabilization programmes are essential
- Livelihood recovery in the shortest possible time should coexist with employment-oriented strategies and local economic recovery
